POPE FRANCIS' RESPONSE TO THE DUBIUM ABOUT BLESSING SAME SEX COUPLES

There has been a lot of unnecessary confusion about this so let's clarify a few things: The pope was replying to a letter from some Cardinals asking for a clear statement on a few issues, such letter is called a "Dubium" The Pope's reply is just that, it is not teaching as you would find it in an Encyclical or an Apostolic Letter.

Essentially the Pope has said nothing new. He was asked about blessing same sex unions. His response was to reaffirm the church's teaching on marriage which comes directly from the teaching of Christ and is unalterable. Marriage is between a man and a woman and is an exclusive relationship. No one can bless any other sort of union in any way that would imply that it is a marriage.

Implicitly included in such a statement is that any form of sexual relationship apart from that found in marriage is forbidden by God. This is abundantly clear from Jesus Himself and St. Paul. So no blessing could be given to any such union which implied that it would or could be acceptable to God. Pope Francis does not say this directly.

We cannot, however, Pope Francis points out, judge people and condemn hem as sinners. This means that, although we can judge actions as good or bad, we can't conclude that the person doing them is therefore bad or a sinner. We always have to approach such situations with mercy and compassion. Priests have to deal with complex and very real human situations. Pope Francis does not think it is wise to start trying to make regulations to govern the enormous variety of these which could present themselves to a priest.

If, for example, a same sex couple, or another good example would be a porn addict, asked someone to pray with them and perhaps bless them as they struggled to overcome their situation and restore their relationship with Jesus then we should really show mercy and compassion. The condition is that whatever we do we should not imply that the way they are relating sexually now (in the case of a norn addict, with their computer or phone) is in any way acceptable to God.

You may think this applies only to priests but a lay person can bless someone and definitely pray for them. Since there have, unfortunately, been a number of abuses in this area the Pope's answer will not satisfy many who long for a clearer direction, but that is up to the judgment of the Pope.

I know the ABC and some others are interpreting this as if the Pope had approved of the blessing of same sex unions as if such a blessing involved approving of gay sexual relationships and treating them as if they were marriage. The problem is he has said no such thing or even implied it. The ABC does have problems with complex statements, however, and I would not trust anything they said about the Catholic Church.

THE FURROW ST JOSEMARIA

684 "This is my Body...", and the immolation of 685 Jesus took place, hidden under the appearances of the bread. He is now there, with his Flesh and with his Blood, with his Soul and with his Divinity. He is the same as on the day that Thomas placed his fingers in His glorious wounds.

And yet, on so many occasions, you saunter by, giving not even a hint of greeting out of simple good manners that you would give to any person you knew when you met him.

You have much less faith than Thomas!

685 If, in order to gain for you your liberty, a close friend of yours had gone to prison, would you not try to visit him, to talk to him for a while, take him some present, console him and show him the warmth of your friendship? And, if that conversation with the prisoner were to save you from some evil and do you good, would you go without it? And if instead of a friend it were to be your father himself or your brother, what then?

686 Jesus has remained in the Sacred Host for us so as to stay by our side, to sustains, to guide us. And love can only be repaid with love.

How could we not turn to the Blessed Sacrament each day, even if it is only for a few minutes, to bring him our greetings and our love as children and as brothers?

687 Imagine the scene. An old sergeant or a young lieutenant sees coming towards him a fine-looking recruit, of an incomparably better quality than the officer, but the salute and its return are still given.

Meditate on the contrast. From the tabernacle of that church, Christ, perfect God, perfect Man, who has died for you on the Cross and gives you everything that you need, approaches you. And you go by without paying any attention to him.
